Loda Wylie submitted a detailed written report. July Income: \$20.273.28; Expenses: \$23.858.76 for a shortfall of \$3,585.48. Year to date income: \$184,864.37, Expenses: \$174,782.24 for a gain of *\$10,082.13. Motion made to accept the report subject to audit – Kris Zimmer, 2nd Marianne Searfoss. *Carried*

*The Youth Fund increased by 7381.04 between May and July. But Cash on hand (not designated) went down 1402.38 so all that extra cash is not available for the congregation to spend as it is in designated accounts.

Beginning Sunday, August 31st we will begin a journey through the book of Acts. Using material from Faith Inkubators called Bible Song. Our primary focus is to share our faith with each other, young and old. Contact Sue Tyler for more information.

Arts-based Children and Family Ministry

Bible Song is the best brain-based method for engaging the hearts of kids. It works in every setting- traditional classrooms, rotational, multi-age, or cross-generational.

Each Bible lesson/theme is taught in multiple ways. The story comes alive in original cartoons, art projects, and easy to do skits. Each lesson features a theme verse of scripture, that is learned in an original song (karaoke style in the PowerPoint- no musician needed!) and also in American sign language.

Bible Song engages the whole body as a learning tool.

What is the FAITH5[™]?

The FAITH 5 connects church to home, faith to life, and parents to kids in a powerful way. The five steps of the FAITH5 are:

Step One: Share highs and lows. Name something good and bad you experienced today. Can't think of a personal one? Check out the head-lines from the news and teach empathy and compassion for the broader world.

Step Two: Read a verse from your Bible. (Each Faith Inkubators curriculum includes suggested verses that kick off at church and go home for families to explore every night.

Step Three: Talk about how the verse relates to highs and lows. Unpack the verse a bit. What does it mean in your own words? How might it relate to where you are today in your highs and lows?

Step Four: Pray for one another's highs and lows, for your family, and for the world. Simply talk to God, thank Jesus for the good, and ask the Holy Spirit for guidance in specific problems.

<u>Step Five: Bless</u> one another. Trace the sign of the cross on one another's forehead or palm as a reminder that you belong to God and to one another.

The FAITH5 isn't really anything new. It's as old as Acts 2. Or maybe Deuteronomy 6.

"Keep these words which I command you today in your hearts. Recite them to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise..."
